THE TEXAS 40 & 8 BOXCAR WILL BE ON PUBLIC DISPLAY AT THE STATE CAPITOL FOR 1 DAY ONLY



The 40 & 8 boxcars were used to transport American Doughboys in France during WW1. These small 20' x 8' rail cars would hold either 40 men or 8 horses!



These same 40 & 8 boxcars were re-purposed after WW2 as a response to the Friendship Train of 1947. In 1949 France sent the "Train de La Reconnaissance" or "Gratitude Train" which consisted of 49 boxcars decorated with French Coats of Arms and each filled with gifts from the people of France.
